The very successful "Night for Art" fundraising event in October resulted in the purchase of Bruno Capolongo's painting: Still Life with Quince and Pence. Plans for the 115th Anniversary celebration are well under way. This

event is being very capably organized by Amanda Mc Kinney and her team. It has long been the hope of your executive that the book about our history: 'The First Hundred Years' could be reprinted for this anniversary year. A number of possibilities were explored but had to be abandoned due to high costs. A recent query sent to Mark Lefebvre at Titles (campus book store at McMaster University) has raised our hopes that this project may yet go forward. Titles has invested in an amazing machine called the McMaster Innovation Press. It is able to print a 250 page paperback in 5 minutes. The charge is per page and there is no requirement to do a set number of copies. The cost per book would be quite reasonable BUT there are some issues that need to be resolved. Our book is not the right size and shape to be easily copied "as is". Mark is very kindly exploring other avenues using "experts" at the university to help us find a way of reaching our goal of having new copies of our history available for a moderate cost. More news regarding this as it becomes available.

Monthly General Meeting November 20

Our last Monthly General Meeting of the calendar year brought our program for the year to a close. Our guest speaker, Dr. Ibrahim Shalaby, had all attendees' attention and all were engrossed with his enthusiasm and methods of making old ideas new again. Dr. Shalaby, whose family roots are from the Middle East, immigrated to Canada in 2002 and is known and has sold art in Canada and internationally. He expresses himself by capturing the essence of his surroundings

old and new and the magical moment of any subject or place he chooses.

To create a certain effect or colour he uses bleach painted or sprinkled on wet or dry ink on paper and masks with broken eggshells. Car paint markers are also put to use with his artistic licence. The standard roof coating called Sicoat is used on wood, asbestos, concrete or bricks as a primer and finish coat to protect from moisture and water. And of course he emphasized the old fashion brush "his thumb" as one of his favourite tools.

Members were eager to look over his art, original works as well as prints, which he had brought in for viewing and for sale. Prints were snapped up by the members at a reasonable price and many members demonstrated a hope of hearing him speak again and having him demonstrate at further length. Some members expressed an interest in workshop lessons.

We will certainly keep this congenial and energetic artist on our list as a future participant within the WAAH.

Monthly Meeting on Thursday, January 15.

We had the great fortune to have Victoria Pearce as our guest speaker. She started her talk with a brief history of her life and then jumped right into her art work. Four of her large paintings were on display for us and they were all very intriguing. Two were from her Northern Ontario collection, and the colours were warm and inviting, and to me, depicted a quiet time in the woods. Victoria's style is almost surreal in presentation and dreamlike. The subjects were misty and calm, and you were immediately drawn into the paintings.

Victoria said that she also loves to paint from an "ants eye view", and this was very evident in her large floral pieces. The backgrounds for these were colourful and very expressive sky-scapes that set the mood and backdrop for her chosen floral subject.

These were then painted with great detail and beautiful colours. Victoria also offers 2 or 3 other views of her subjects within the same painting, bringing you an up close and personal, and sometimes abstract view of what she sees.

Victoria encouraged all present to keep learning and challenging ourselves and our artistic abili-

ties, and to not be afraid of trying something new with our art. In this way, we can prove to ourselves that we can express our own view and put our own energy into our work and therefore discover our own style(s).

Her work was lovely and stunning, creative and unusual. Victoria has definitely found her own path and her own style of painting.
